I am delighted to extend my warm greetings on the launch of this newsletter. It serves as a platform to inform and update our dedicated colleagues, management team, volunteers and internal stakeholders about the latest developments and departmental information happening in CASS, thereby enhancing mutual understanding of our work and experiences, fostering information exchange and sharing, and promoting internal unity and effective communication.

Since its establishment in 1981, CASS has traversed a remarkable journey spanning over forty-two years. Currently, we are on a trajectory of stable growth, having a team of exceeding 620 employees and over 350 active volunteers. When we acquired the property for our Community Hall, the private vendor demanded the purchase of 2 adjacent land parcels together. With no government funding, assets nor bank loan support, Dr. Leng Tan and three others pledged their personal assets to secure an agreement and repay the cost. Such noble voluntary spirit propelled the thriving success of CASS.



CASS is not an institution owned by an individual but belongs to the public, requiring everyone's care and impetus to ensure it meets the evolving needs of community and keeps pace with the rapid developments of our time. As individuals living in this world, we should not merely focus on material gains or pursue personal interests, instead, we shall care for and support one another.

On this occasion of the inaugural issue of our CASS newsletter, I encourage the younger generation to embrace the spirit of volunteering, carry it forward, and support CASS in expanding its high-quality services to multicultural communities in Australia. Let us continue our noble mission of selfless dedication and make a positive impact on the lives of those we serve. Together, we can build a stronger and more inclusive society.

CORPORATE NEWS

01 CASS CHARITY DINNER FOR BUILDING RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE FACILITY IN ASQUITH



On 11 March, we held a Charity Dinner at Rhodes Phoenix Chinese Restaurant to raise fund for the building of our residential aged care facility (RACF) in Asquith. Nearly 600 people attended the glamorous and lively event.

In his welcoming speech, Dr. Bo Zhou, the Chairperson of our boards, said, “CASS built its first RACF in Campsie eleven years ago. With the support of people from all walks of life, building works progressed smoothly and the Facility was completed and commenced operation in early 2015. During the past eight years of operation, the Facility was highly recognised for its performance, passing a series of quality checks by relevant authority and receiving praise from many service users. It has a long queue on the waiting list.”

“In view of the strong demand for residential aged care services in the community, we started planning for the building of our second RACF since 2017. To this end, we have acquired land in Asquith with bank loans. After five years of unceasing dedicated efforts, we obtained Development Approval from the council to build a new 97-bed RACF as well as an adjacent block of 11 independent living units (ILU). Once completed, the project will provide high-quality services for frail elderly people of multicultural backgrounds, offering culturally and linguistically appropriate care and services. Building a RACF is a massive and complex project requiring huge financial resources. Apart from bank loans, we need to raise about \$6 million to make the project possible. If the required fund is in place, the Facility will be operational in July this year. This will be another important milestone of CASS for our community services.”

Dr. Zhou also announced at the dinner that the number of senior clients using our Home Ageing Services had exceeded 2,000, and the service users included Chinese, Korean, Indonesian, Vietnamese and people of the general community and the number is growing every week. He also congratulated Mr. Henry Pan OAM, CASS Foundation Chairperson and Honorary Executive Director, who had just won at the 2023 Harmony Dinner the Premier’s “SBS Lifetime Community Service Medal”.

The charity dinner concluded joyfully with enthusiastic donations.

02 CAMPSIE RACF PASSED THE ACCREDITATION

Our RACF in Campsie underwent an unannounced accreditation check between 28 and 30 March 2023 for 3 days by Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (ACQSC). Three assessors came onsite and conducted assessment of the quality of care and services provided against the Aged Care Quality Standards. The outcome of the assessment is: we met all 8 Quality Standards and passed the accreditation.

A gathering was held by our Board on 12 May 2023 to express appreciation to the Campsie RACF team members for passing the accreditation.



03 ASQUITH PROJECT PROGRESS

Do you know that our new RACF in Asquith will soon be in operation, tentatively scheduled for October 2023? Since 2017, we have been planning for building a new RACF in Asquith because our existing RACF in Campsie has been running at full capacity since its commencement, resulting in a very long waiting list.

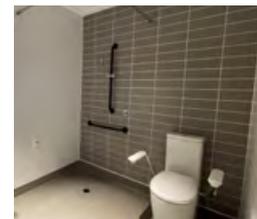
This new RACF with 97 beds, each with single-room, is located in a residential area with shopping centres, transportation facilities and other social venues nearby. It will serve frail aged people of East and Southeast Asian backgrounds, providing culturally and linguistically appropriate care and services. This includes meal arrangements and activities, enabling seniors to age gracefully and happily. Additionally, there will be eleven one-bed and two-bedroom Independent Living Units (ILU), along with a spacious activity hall, catering to the leisure and recreation needs of the residents and local seniors. It will be the perfect place for the elderly to age in style and comfort.

We have raised funds for the new project through various events and functions, and the project is now in the final stages of construction. You are welcome to make donations to support and help make our vision a reality. 06 CONNECT CALL SERVICE FOR THE KOREAN COMMUNITY COMMENCED

Our Connect Call Service has been helping seniors of Chinese background for more than 10 years since 2012. The service is provided by trained volunteers aiming to prevent seniors from social isolation due to language barrier and mobility. By calling the seniors regularly, they are facilitated to contact the outside world, participate in the community, get social support and assistance when needed, increase their sense of belonging, and enhance their quality of life while they live in Australia.

Since 15 May 2023, the service has been made available to Korean-speaking seniors as well. Volunteers have been trained professionally to deliver the service on a weekly basis.

Do you know our Xiaohongshu platform has taken the social media scene by storm, and our fan base has soared past the incredible milestone of 10,000 followers?

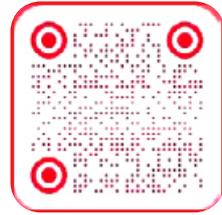
In just one and a half years, our Promotions Team captured the hearts of our readers with captivating and exclusive content!

Service Extension: Connect Call for the Chinese Seniors

We believe regular telephone conversations can comfort our seniors living in social isolation and keep them active. Since 2012, we have recruited volunteers to provide weekly telephone calls to seniors. We match seniors' backgrounds and interests with suitable volunteers who can speak Cantonese, Mandarin, Shanghaiese and other dialects. Volunteers also share updated news and community information to keep seniors connected to community.

From July 2023, this tailor-made free "Connect Call" service will be extended to all of our Chinese-speaking Home Care Packages (HCP) clients. It will be a step-by-step service extension; our unit will gradually match volunteers and start the telephone service. Watch our volunteers' [video](#) to learn more. Service Extension: Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme

Entering its 10th anniversary, CASS Community Visitors Scheme has supported over 100 seniors by appropriate volunteers who arranged regular visits. Seniors and volunteers with common languages and interests are matched. They can have friendly chats, share hobbies, or travel to parks and café together. Madam Wei and Volunteer Lily, for example, are celebrating their 10-year friendship.

Recently, the Federal Government has increased our project size from this financial year until June 2026. The program has also been restructured and named "Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme" (ACVVS). Our service will be extended to Korean and Vietnamese-speaking seniors as well.

Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (ACVVS) aims to support isolated and lonely seniors who are receiving Australian Government-funded aged care services. Volunteers are matched to arrange regular visits, to provide friendship and companionship to our targeted aged people.

What services can be provided?
Seniors will be matched with volunteers with common languages, hobbies or interests. Long-term friendships can keep seniors active and reduce loneliness. Volunteers will visit seniors at least once a fortnight. They can do the following together:

- Chatting;
- Common interests, such as reading books & news, music, handicrafts, gardening
- Traveling to parks or café (if appropriate)
- Other activities

Who are volunteers?
Volunteers participate in providing free services. Each volunteer will go through an interview, background scanning and a series of training programs. All volunteers will have the support of a dedicated team. You are welcome to join our volunteer team.

WHAT YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT CASS

How Much Do You Know About CASS?

Probably you know CASS is providing community services to over 5,500 families in the multicultural community every week with a workforce of over 620 employees and 350+ volunteers.

We are commonly known in the community as “CASS”, our brand name. There are two entities in CASS, both of which are registered charities. The parent Company is the Chinese Australian Services Society Ltd. (we refer to it as “The Society”), and it is a communal organisation; CASS Care Ltd. is a subsidiary of the Society, and it is a multicultural community services provider. It is approved by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI), and this is the reason why our colleagues can have salary packaging benefit.

But what about the organisational structure in CASS? Each entity of CASS has a Board of Directors, and there are three directorates under the two Boards overseen by the Honorary Executive Director (HED).

Community Services Directorate consists of our core operational community services, including Residential Aged Care Services (RACS), Home Ageing Services (HAS), Disability Services (DS), and Child Care Services (CCS).

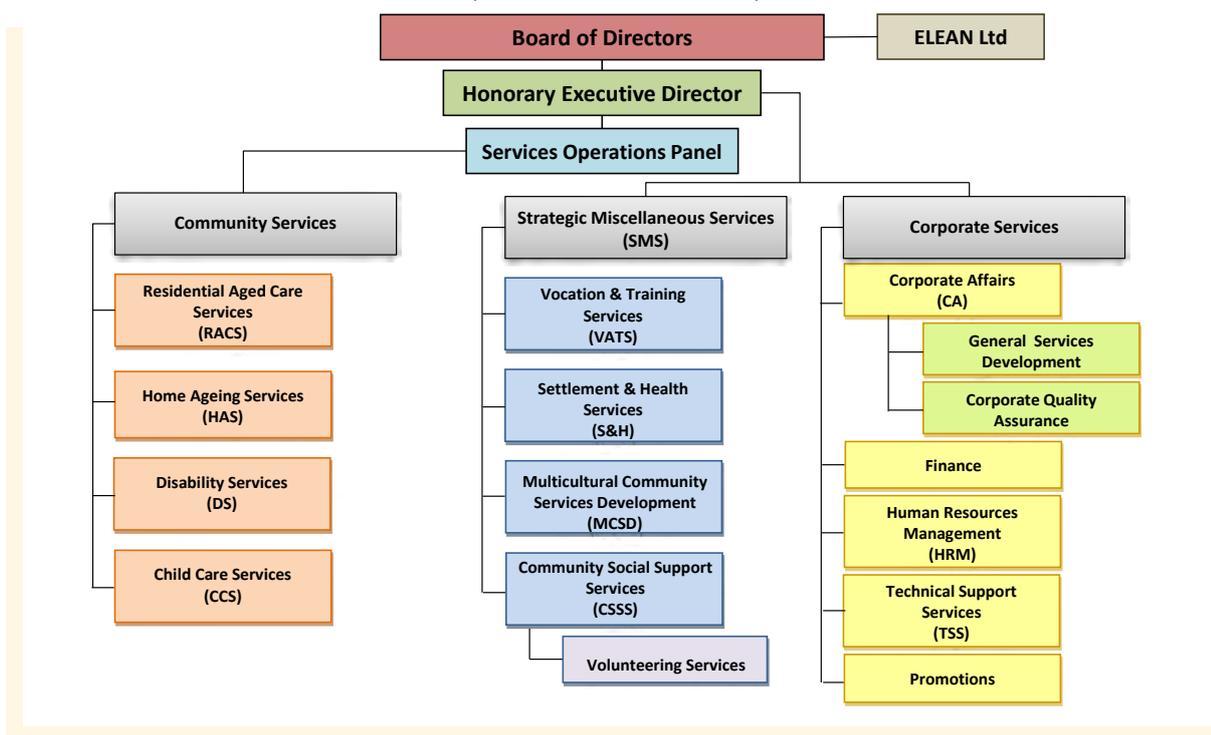
Strategic Miscellaneous Services (SMS) Directorate includes services that leverage the core services. Such services include Vocation & Training Services (VATS), Settlement & Health Services (S&H), Multicultural Community Services Development (MCSD) and Community Social Support Services (CSSS).

Corporate Services Directorate provides services and support internally to all service units. It includes Corporate Affairs (CA), Finance, Human Resources Management (HRM), Technical Support Services (TSS) and Promotions.

The chart below shows the current structure of CASS. Now you have a clearer picture of our organisation.

As you are aware, to be able to work in the Federal Public Service, one must be an Australian citizen. This is because the commitment required of a public servant to serve Australia is so high that only a citizen of Australia is considered to have the commitment to fulfill, especially in executing plans to look after the interests of Australia. Similar reason applies to the situation when one is working for a community organisation providing social and welfare services to the community. To demonstrate the commitment of an employee in formulating and executing plans serving the community to realise the objectives of the community organisation, it is essential for the employee to join the community organisation as a member.

As a member of our Society, one has voting rights to decide on issues affecting the Society and its objectives. In addition, a member can elect members of the Board of Directors and Council of Elders – just like Australian public servants are able to vote to elect the Government.

While working in CASS and as a member of our Society, a person is not eligible to be elected as a Board or Council member, however, the person is eligible to attend and speak freely in all general meetings of our Society to express the views of the person on issues confronting our Society, including the performance of the Board.
