MY JOURNEY AT CASS

MESSAGE FROM VICE-CHAIRPERSON MR. IVAN WONG



It is an incredible privilege to share my journey from a staff member to a Board Member at CASS. Reflecting on my 30 years with the organisation, I am deeply inspired by its remarkable growth and meaningful impact on the community.

One of the most unforgettable projects I was part of was our first residential aged care facility (RACF) located in Campsie, back in early 2012, when we obtained government approval. I admit, I was nervous at first. Managing a construction project was completely new for me, and we were building everything from scratch. But with good teamwork, persistence and determination, we pulled through, and looking at what we have accomplished now, it feels awesome.



Another milestone in aged care services was the comprehensive reform of Home Care Packages (HCP) brought in 2017 by the Government. This transformation led to a remarkable increase in our consumer numbers, expanding from 107 seniors to over 2,300, including Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP), by 2024. This growth required us to expand our workforce and completely overhaul our management systems. It was another case of learning everything from scratch, but again, we did it.

As we prepare for the next wave of reform in the Support at Home Program, I am confident that our team will be ready to embrace the changes and optimise our services.

For my role on the Board, I remain committed to sharing strategic ideas to help CASS manage risks and make the most of new opportunities.

Remember to stay positive, proactive, and open to change. A growth mindset is essential to overcoming challenges, whether at work or in any stage of life.

2. HOME AGEING SERVICES (HAS)

New Aged Care Act Postponed to November 2025

On 4 June 2025, the Hon. Sam Rae MP, Minister for Aged Care and Seniors, announced that the implementation of the new Aged Care Act—originally scheduled for 1 July 2025—will be postponed to 1 November 2025. This extension is intended to provide additional time to finalise supporting systems and ensure stakeholders are well-informed and prepared for the forthcoming changes.

In the interim, CASS will continue delivering all existing aged care services without interruption. These include the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP), Home Care Packages (HCP), and Short Term Restorative Care (STRC), which will operate as usual.



New Digital Skills Workshop in Wollongong



3. MULTICULTURAL COMMUNITY SERVICES DEVELOPMENT (MCSD)

“Each week, I attend the group where I can both learn English and join in social activities, sharing life experiences with my friends.




In our last quarterly newsletter, we took you inside our Campsie office. This issue, we are excited to introduce the dedicated team members working across various locations.




