As we begin 2026, we reflect on the past year's accomplishments, which were made possible through your efforts and contributions to the CASS team.

In **March**, we celebrated [the achievement of two milestones](#), namely, 40 Years of CASS Gumnut Early Learning Centre – Campsie and 10 Years of CASS Campsie Residential Aged Care Facility (RACF).



We proudly honoured over 450 active volunteers who collectively contributed approximately 39,000 hours of service to the community this year. Among them, we were delighted that [our Chairperson, Professor Stephen Li, was named Volunteer of the Year at the Third Sector Awards](#), and we celebrated the achievement at [our Volunteers' Thanksgiving Luncheon](#) in September.

In **September**, we launched [CASS Women's Connect](#), a heartfelt initiative offering a safe and confidential space at the Women's Rest Centre in Campsie, supported by trained female volunteers to empower women through compassion and care.



In **November**, we were proud of [our Teaching Director, Ms. Monalisa Jani, serving at CASS Gumnut Early Learning Centre – St Leonards, who received the Director/Nominated Supervisor Excellence Award at the Excellence in Early Childhood Education Awards 2025.](#)

In **December**, we celebrated [the grand opening of our Asquith Residential Aged Care Facility](#). The facility offers 97 single rooms, each with a private ensuite, as well as an adjacent block of 11 Independent Living Units and a community hall, all thoughtfully designed to foster connection, comfort, and a true sense of belonging. Since commencing operations in May 2024, the facility has almost reached full capacity, and it welcomed more than 137 residents from multicultural backgrounds.

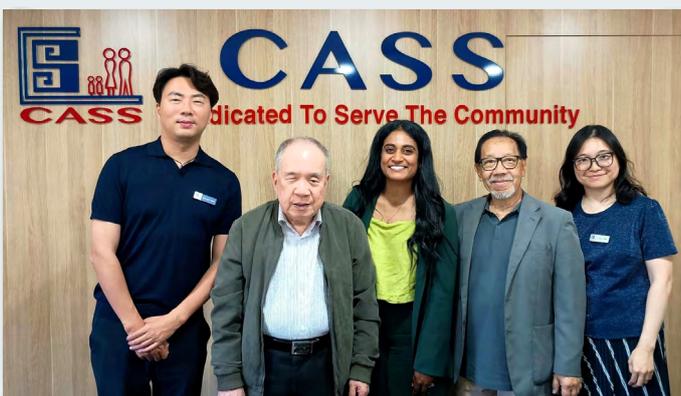
2 The Grand Opening of CASS Asquith Residential Aged Care Facility

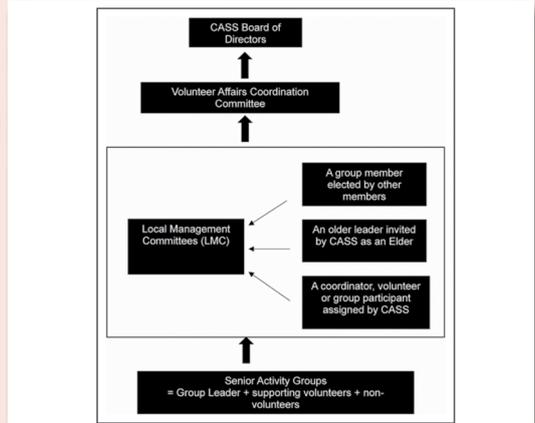
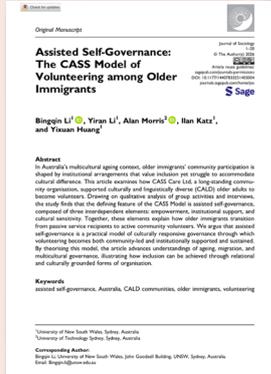


Figure 1. Organisational Structure of CASS Community Volunteering. Source: Figure Drawn by Authors Based on Interviews with CASS Management Staff.

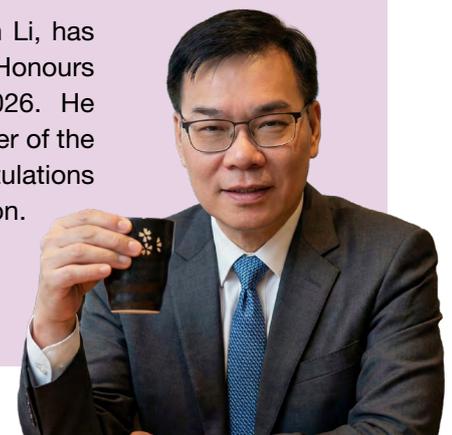
5 CASS Asquith RACF Reached Full Capacity

It was an enjoyable and valuable experience that provided useful insights to bring back to CASS.

“I am writing to express my deepest gratitude for the incredible care the team have provided to my mother.

Living in the United States, thousands of miles away from family, can be a source of constant anxiety. However, for nearly a decade, CASS has replaced that worry with peace of mind. Through the regular updates, good news, and photos you send, we have always felt connected to her life despite the distance.

Above and Beyond: The Kindness of Betty

I want to highlight a specific experience that truly touched our hearts. As my mother aged, she began to struggle with using her iPad for our video calls. During this time, the staff member, Betty, stepped in to bridge the gap.

Betty did far more than just “assist.” To ensure we had a clear view and a meaningful connection, she sometimes had to kneel on the floor for extended periods just to hold the camera at the perfect angle for my mother; act as an “interpreter” and facilitator, patiently helping my mother communicate despite her serious hearing difficulties.

When my mother’s own iPad broke, Betty immediately used a facility device to ensure our family calls were never interrupted.

Seeing my mother healthy, happy, and well-cared for is the greatest gift our family could receive. It is clear to us that the service is not just “work”—it is a mission. The “magic” we see in CASS’s service only happens when professional excellence is combined with genuine human love.

CASS has shown us the true beauty of the human spirit. From the bottom of my heart, thank you for the kindness, the detailed attention, and the love it showed my mother every day. We will always remember what CASS have done for our family.”

WHAT YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT CASS CASS Activity Groups

To support seniors in our community to enjoy more recreational and cultural activities, maintain a healthy lifestyle, and enhance social integration, CASS has established a range of Activity Groups, open to all individuals aged 55 and above.

Many of our activity groups are managed by a local member committee together with our volunteers and coordinators. They offer a wide variety of programs such as English conversation classes, singing, dancing, gentle exercise, Tai Chi series, Chinese ink painting, harmonica learning, tea gatherings, outdoor excursions, health seminars, and more. These activities generally take place once a week and provide opportunities for seniors to meet friends who share similar languages, cultural backgrounds, and interests.



Do you know which is our very first activity group and when was it established?

The answer is: our Campsie Hua An Seniors Group which was founded in 1993. For over 32 years, it has been continuing to thrive, with many members who are now over 80 years old still participating actively.

And can you guess how many activity groups do we currently have?

The answer is: 55!

Our group members come from multicultural communities, including Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, and Indonesian, etc. Our activity locations are spread across the Greater Sydney region, including



Wollongong, with about 3,000 participants every week.

Our activity groups are one of the best ways for seniors to stay active while expanding their social network. If your family members are interested, we warmly welcome you to contact us and enjoy a richer, healthier lifestyle together.

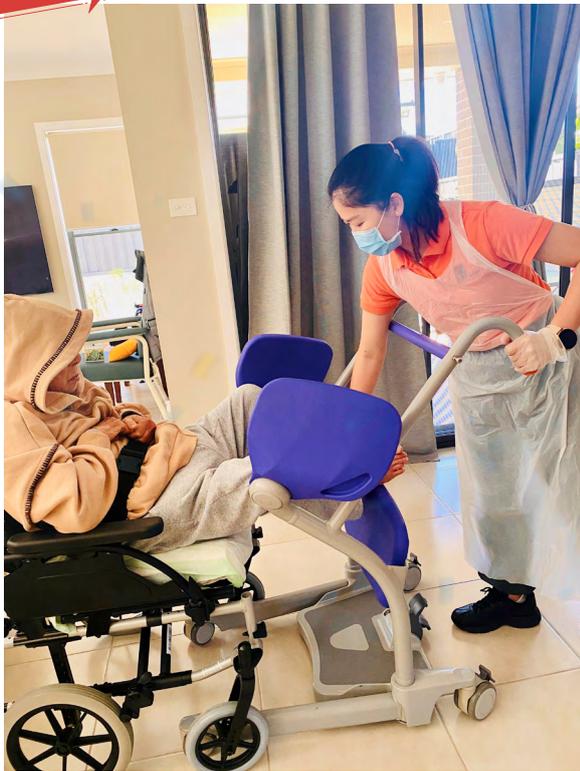
